The Research and Education Foundation (REF) of the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) broke all previous fundraising records in the Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow at Family Medicine Forum (FMF) 2010 in Vancouver, BC. Starting at the site of the Olympic torch lighting, 180 registered participants walked, ran, or strolled with their children along the seawall to beautiful Stanley Park. Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow celebrated a sweet sixth anniversary and surpassed its totals in previous years by raising \$29 848!

The Family Medicine Interest Group (FMIG) from the University of Manitoba owned by podium by raising \$3350. As ever, it was a tight match with the FMIG from Calgary close on their heels. For the last 4 years, FMIGs from across the country have been competing to raise the most pledges. The winning team receives a handsome trophy, a congratulatory banner, a cheque to support FMIG activities at its university, and most importantly, bragging rights! This year there was an added bonusteam jackets for each of the registered participants.

Social media were used for the first time to get the word out about the walk. On May 14, the first tweets were sent from http://twitter.com/#!/WalkforDocs. We think this innovation nearly doubled the turnout. There were also a record number of teams assembled—14 in all. Electronic registration for the walk was available in the FMF exhibit hall at College Square. The popularity of these features ensures that they will be used again in the future.

Congratulations are due to all those who participated. Everyone wins when the result is funding for medical student scholarships: recipients are supported in their pursuit of a rewarding career in family medicine, awareness is raised for the discipline within the 17 medical schools across Canada, and recognition of the value of family doctors is increased.
