Largest amount ever raised at REF Annual Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow!

With a tremendous amount of spirit and energy, 120 participants helped raise \$17000 at the Research and Education Foundation's (REF) annual Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow. It was the largest amount ever raised. Proceeds from the annual walk support the College of Family Physicians of Canada's Medical Student Scholarship Program.

Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow first took place in 2005 with 35 participants raising a total of \$3240. In 2006, \$6835 was raised with 85 participants, and in 2007 \$14 590 was collected with the help of 110 walkers. With its increasing popularity, organizers of the walk are noticing a substantial rise in pledges and participation, indicating that the Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow is growing and catching on with medical students and College members across Canada.

The walk is held in various cities at the time of the College's Family Medicine Forum. This year it took place on a bright sunny Saturday morning in November in Toronto, Ont. The route led participants along University Avenue and past Ontario's historic legislative

Last year the University of Calgary's team captured the victory, but lost this year to Dalhousie University's high-spirited group who showed no mercy to its

competitors. Visitors to Dalhousie University will see the proudly displayed winning trophy and banner acknowledging the success of the Dalhousie FMIG in raising the most pledges for the Walk for the Docs of Tomorrow. 2007 REF summary of revenue and disbursements

The Research and Education Foundation's donations and interest revenues to the end of 2007 totaled \$342 872 and consisted of \$146 542 from individual donors, \$133 823 from corporate and foundation donors, and \$72 720 from interest on endowments and reserves. In 2007, members contributed a total of \$6219 to the Endowment funds: the Hollister King Fund, the Ian McWhinney Fund, the Jean-Pierre Despins Fund, and the Donald I. Rice Fund. Since the
