The Besrour Centre for Global Family Medicine (Besrour Centre) is a hub of international collaboration dedicated to advancing family medicine globally through partnerships in low- and middle-income countries. The Centre was founded in 2015 in collaboration with Dr. Sadok Besrour, whose experience, gained while developing family medicine in his native Tunisia, Africa, inspired the Centre's mandate.

In August 2022 Dr. Besrour and his family took a decisive step in establishing their legacy as champions of family medicine on the global stage with the creation of the Fond Janine Bombardier pour le Centre Besrour, brokered by the Foundation for Advancing Family Medicine (FAFM). The Fond is a charitable trust dedicated to supporting the activities of the Besrour Centre through annual donations and it has been seeded with generous gifts from Dr. Besrour and his eponymous foundation. As the Fond grows with philanthropic contributions from friends and supporters of Dr. Besrour's vision, the College of Family Physicians of Canada™ (CFPC)-based Besrour Centre will benefit from increasing funding support.

Dr. David Ponka, Director of the Besrour Centre, joined Claudia Zuccato Ria, Executive Director of the FAFM, in expressing his gratitude to Dr. Besrour for choosing the Besrour Centre as the recipient of his generosity and the vehicle to establishing his legacy.

"The Besrour name is highly recognized in the international family medicine community as a symbol of inspiration for building equitable access to health care around the world," Dr. Ponka said. "The Fond Janine Bombardier pour le Centre Besrour solidifies Dr. Besrour's and his family's commitment to the Centre and its vision – to lead the way in creating a world where no one is left behind when it comes to accessing quality primary care."

New Endowment Fund Honours the Legacy of Dr. David Gass



On March 19, 2021, the world of family medicine in Canada lost one of its most respected and cherished members with the sudden passing of Dr. David Gass. The loss reverberated across the country, through the halls of medical universities, federal health departments, and patient communities. The outpouring of heartfelt tributes that followed included generous in-memoriam donations to the FAFM.

In discussion with Dr. Gass' partner, Dr. Cathy Cervin, Past President of the CFPC Board, the FAFM has established the Dr. David Gass Legacy Education Endowment Fund to sustain the FAFM's Scholarly Work in Family Medicine Education Grant. This grant is conferred annually to academic and communitybased family physician members of the CFPC in leading projects in medical education.

"Dr. Gass' legacy as an educator, leader, colleague, and friend to so many is reflected in the spirit of the Scholarly Work grant," said Dr. Ivy Oandasan, Director of Education at the CFPC. "His memory will be sustained through this education endowment fund and inspire future generations of family medicine educators in Canada."

The FAFM is honoured to be the recipient of Dr. Gass' fund. The fund accepts donations on a continuous basis.

Co-RIG Global Reaches Indonesia and South Africa

Shortly after the World Health Organization declared a global pandemic in 2020, the FAFM and the Besrour Centre recognized the urgent need to support family medicine's pandemic response in at-risk communities around the world. Inspired by the Canadian Co-RIG program, developed by the FAFM with the generous support of the CMA Foundation, the Besrour Centre launched Global Co-RIG.

Global Co-RIG Phase I granted \$50,000 to two projects, one in Aceh, Indonesia, and the other in Cape Town, South Africa. These projects are tackling challenges of chronic disease management made more acute by the pandemic in their communities.
