Since 1972 the CFPC has honoured family doctor members who exemplify excellence in the guiding principles of family medicine. In 1996 the award became known as the Reg L. Perkin Awards in honour of Dr. Perkin, who was the CFPC's executive director from 1985 to 1996.

The awards are presented to 11 outstanding family physicians—one from each province and one for the territories—during FMF. Canada's Family Physicians of the Year are nominated by their health care colleagues, community leaders, and provincial Chapters of the CFPC for providing exceptional care to their patients, making meaningful contributions to the health and well-being of their communities, and dedicating themselves as researchers and as educators of future generations of family doctors.
